Please register early to ensure space for your child!

Each day, the students will participate in:

- large group rehearsals and small group sectionals (by instrument and age).
- music theory class, where they learn about and experience the fundamentals of music.
- organized games and activities including softball, kickball, dodgeball and board or card games.
- lunch with friends and camp staff.

Students are to provide a sack lunch each day. They may bring water bottles - there is a filler in the cafeteria!
